



Hello Fellow Zontians


Have you registered for the District 6, Area 2 Workshop? If not, please do so soon. There are lots of reasons to attend and the following are just a few.

MARCH 10 ADVOCACY INTO ACTION SUSPENDED – BUT COMING BACK IN A NEW FORMAT

We are "suspending" Advocacy Into Action on March 10 at this time due to insufficient registrants. A few more are added each day but we are substantially below expectations. Suspending it now allows us to cancel our contract with the venue before our final and substantial payment is due.

However -- we're not canceling the intent and effort but are re-packaging it into a different format that we will bring out this Fall - maybe September, with an initial focus on one issue - ERA. The same speakers who would have carried this issue at AIA are already on board to come up and are awaiting a date. They are a dynamic team. We will still work with partners but in more of an information sharing manner rather than so deeply involved in recruiting participants. We will specifically seek out the involvement of the League of Women Voters – Dane County.

If you're wondering why we picked ERA for September, see the article in this newsletter about the Feb 27 Empowered Exchange that focused on state and federal ERAs. Quite a discussion that night.

We did make some important contacts with new possible partners through the March 10 event and will be following up to seek ongoing relationships with them. Stay tuned for more information as the Advocacy committee moves forward on this. Also, if you think this is important, consider volunteering for the Advocacy committee in our upcoming Zonta year that starts June 1.

If this isn't your cup of tea, there are other committees addressing interesting things that also need your help. Then there is the issue of accepting an office or board position. Hmmmm Just sayin'.

Membership Committee – JoAnn Gruber-Hagen

The March 27 Empowered Exchange lived up to its name. Under the leadership of Membership Committee member Shirley Senarighi, a robust and engaging discussion ensued on the topic of state and federal Equal Rights Amendments. Eight members gathered and everyone came well prepared with references, opinions and questions and we all learned a lot from each other.

Some things learned included:

- The only constitutionally protected right that women have in the U.S. is the right to vote. All other rights we presently have are protected by enacted laws that can be relatively easily legislated out of existence or over-turned by judicial opinions.
- The Federal ERA has recently met the 38state minimum adoption of the ERA but there is disagreement if the time had run out and is therefore invalid.

- 3. The National Archivist could decide it is valid and officially adopt the ERA and amend the Constitution.
- 4. A bill seeking an ERA in WI has been submitted to the WI Assembly each of the past two sessions, neither of which were moved forward by Assembly leadership.

The evening ended with the eight members agreeing that Zonta should carve out an effective role in bringing public attention to the need for adopting the ERA to constitutionally support women having the same rights as the Constitution already guarantees men. The group urges the Advocacy Committee to take club leadership for this including identifying other partners who share a mission to achieve adoption of state and federal ERAs.

Our final act was to sign the online petition to adopt the federal ERA and we took out picture to document it. As the picture says, JOIN US! You can sign and submit the petition at https://www.sign4era.org/ It is also possible to download a printable copy of the petition and make copies to get others to sign. The New Zonta Website Calendar Is Now Here!!



The Zonta website home page now has a link to a "Calendar of Events". This calendar defaults to a monthly calendar format, but also has a button which will show events in a List format. As you click on an event in either format, you will be directed to a detailed description of the event, showing the location, organizer and other pertinent information. There is a search tool for the calendar, but that has not yet been implemented to any extent.

Zonta Club of Madison, Area 2, Region 6 and International events will be shown on the calendar. Also included will be club committee meetings, and dates of interest, such as newsletter submission deadlines and scholarship submission deadlines.

Since the calendar will rest on the Home page and will be viewable to the public, Zonta meetings that may include attached agendas or personal member information that are not meant for the public will be password protected. These events will have the word "Protected" in the event title. Club members will be emailed information on the password to these protected items.

Also included in the calendar will be club Partner Events, such as the date of the "Girls on the Run" 5K event and the Wisconsin Women's Network "Feminism on Tap" events.
