League of Women Voters - Dane County (LWV-DC) invites Zonta members to work with them on upcoming registration drives, <u>June 3-July 24</u>, and <u>Sept 3-October 16</u>.

As has been shared with Zonta members previously, LWV-DC has developed a successful program in cooperation with the WI Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to support new and updated voter registrations.

The first DMV voter registration support drive of the 2024 election year was a success with 291 registrations completed. DMV clients who registered while they were there were grateful to be able to take care of two matters at once. Volunteers valued the experience to help voters register themselves saying "I am honored to take part in this project" and "This makes me feel like I'm making a difference."

Volunteers work in 2-person teams. Each team of will have a person who is experienced in doing this. There are two training online programs that you need to complete before your first shift – one 10-minute and one 15-minute. Links to these are on the online SuperGenius SignUp pages listed below.





Dreaming in Spanish: An Unexpected Love Story in Puerto Vallarta

At age twenty-four, Sara Alvarado bought a one-way ticket from the Midwest to Mexico determined to heal from years of hard partying and sexual trauma. In this raw and inspiring memoir, Sara takes readers on a journey as she struggles with being newly Sober, unexpectedly in love - and then suddenly, terrifyingly pregnant.

The book is about listening to her intuition and trusting that this is the story that wanted to be told now. It's also about finding the courage to shine a light on what usually stays hidden, to normalize conversations about tough topics like substance abuse, sexual trauma, white privilege, mixed families and more.


